Attachment 2 Response regarding Tree Law Enforcement

Good afternoon and thank you for your patience while I followed-up.

- My understanding from the Parks Dept. is that Jeff is in touch with the Tree Committee concerning the village's most recent tree order. The trees will be delivered Monday 4/14 and depending on what time delivery is we will start planting right away.
- When PD receives a complaint when the Building Dept. is closed, they respond to the area and assess the situation, rely on Village code for guidance, document, stop the work if it's violating a law and makeS a referral to the Building Department for follow up.
- The Building Dept. does maintain a list of all Tree Removal Permits.
- All Building Inspectors and Code Enforcement Officers are familiar with the Tree Law

Thank you Charles

I would like to propose a change to the tree law as follows:

Consider a minimum number of trees a certain property should hold after which no replanting is required unless of course the removal of a tree would bring the total number of trees under that threshold.

For example, consider a tree for every 2000 sqft of property to be sufficient (to be clear the tree/sqft ratio given, although reasonable in my view, is only provided as an example). In this example, a property that is 0.5 acres (sqft 21,500) does not have to be replanted after removal of a tree as long as the total tree count stays above 11 trees.

Rationale: if your property already has a certain number of trees, the replanting requirement becomes difficult.

Where do you put a tree so that it can grow? The current law punishes those homeowners who already have a high number of trees on their property, in particular because a large tree needs to be replaced with 2 other trees. Also, it takes away a hesitance to plant trees, a hesitance stemming from the need to keep some space if a large tree needs to be removed. A homeowner that has a ratio of one tree for every 2,000 sqft of property should be rewarded, not punished as is indirectly happening through the current tree law.


