MESSAGE FROM VILLAGE MANAGER KATHLEEN GILL

We began 2026 with significant progress on flood resiliency, including the Village's award of over \$9 million in state grant funding in January 2026 to advance major flood mitigation projects. As we move through the year, the Village of Mamaroneck remains focused on three core priorities: reducing flood risk, strengthening our infrastructure, and investing in the quality of life that makes our "Friendly Village" such a special place to live, work, and visit.

In the months ahead, we will continue working with Westchester County, New York State, and our federal partners on long-term flood mitigation efforts, while advancing local initiatives such as bridge and seawall improvements, stormwater upgrades, and neighborhood resilience planning. We are also looking ahead to 2026 projects that will support our downtown business district, enhance our waterfront parks, and expand recreation opportunities for residents of all ages.

Thank you for your patience and continued involvement as we move through complex planning, design, and construction work that will shape our community for years to come. Please stay informed, participate in public meetings, and reach out with questions or concerns. To receive timely updates, I encourage residents to sign up for Village email notifications and emergency alerts.

FLOOD MITIGATION UPDATE

The Village continues to advance multiple projects to reduce flood risk and strengthen storm resiliency. In January 2026, the Village was awarded \$9,976,250 through New York State's Resilient Watersheds Grant Program to advance flood mitigation projects designed to improve flood flow conveyance and reduce flood risk in areas. The award funds removal of the Tompkins Avenue Bridge and related work (\$1,782,500), removal of the Center Avenue pedestrian bridge and related work (\$5,203,750), and channel alignment at the confluence and related work (\$2,990,000).

Separately, the Green Resiliency Grant (GRG), awarded by the NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation, provides \$6.6 million with a required local match of \$733,000. The funded scope focuses on designing and constructing flood benches upstream and downstream of the Ward Avenue Bridge and at the confluence, with other unfunded project costs the subject of a separate funding request pending with NYSDEC. Staff and the Village's consultant are completing EFC's checklist to execute the grant agreement, including SEQR. The SEQR process is currently delayed after SHPO declined to issue a Letter of No Effect related to historic stone retaining walls along portions of the rivers, but the Village is working with SHPO and partner agencies to address requirements and keep the project moving.

Coordination continues with the Army Corps, DEC, and Westchester County on the Ward Avenue Bridge replacement and the broader flood mitigation program. The Village also received notice of DEC Climate Smart Communities grant awards for stream gauges and for a comprehensive emergency management plan with training and exercises (grant agreements expected in March), alongside work to update the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan and develop a public, interactive GIS map of flood mitigation projects and studies.

The Village of Mamaroneck offers a weekly Food Scraps Pick Up Program for eligible Village residents residing in residential properties exclusive of apartment buildings. There is a \$52 annual subscription fee to receive weekly curbside pickup. To sign up, call the Department of Public Works at 914-777-7745 to be placed on the pickup list. Residents may also drop off food scraps at no cost at the Village's Department of Public Works, 313 Fayette Avenue.

Food Scrap kits, including compostable bags as well as the large, lidded green transportation food scraps bucket, can be purchased at the Village's Department of Public Works at 313 Fayette Avenue or Village Hall at 123 Mamaroneck Avenue.

Since 2018, the Village's food scraps recycling program has collected over 400 tons of food scraps, diverting them into valuable compost that gives back to our nutrient life cycle. Food scraps recycling is important because it keeps organic waste out of landfills where it can generate methane and instead supports composting that returns nutrients to the soil. As a bonus, separating food scraps can help keep your garbage smelling better.

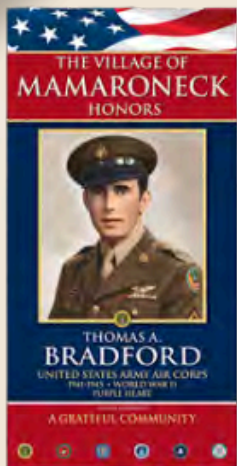

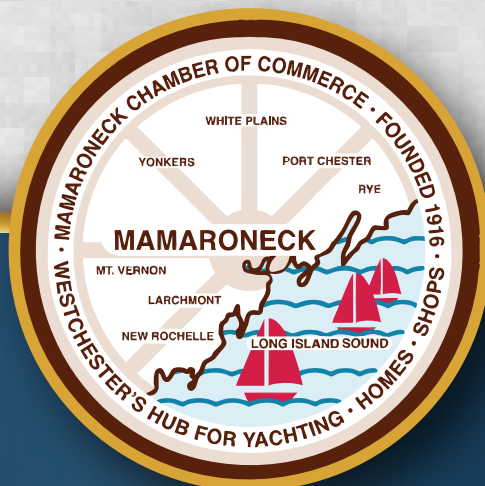
